

Administrative Procedures

You are to undergo dialysis or be hospitalized

- **If you have French Social Security coverage, bring your :**
 - Vital social security card as well as the certificate confirming its validity indicating the declaration of a treating physician.
 - Certificate of complementary coverage (card indicating subscription to private health insurance).
 - Your treatment booklet if you benefit from Article 115 of the French Public Health Code (100% coverage).
- **If you benefit from the universal health coverage scheme, bring your :**
 - Universal health coverage certificate (Couverture Maladie Universelle: CMU) or State Medical Assistance certificate (Aide Médicale d'Etat - AME).
- **If you are a citizen of the European Union, bring your :**
 - European health insurance card.
- **If you do not have social security coverage,**
 - you can ask the admissions office or the social worker for information on the possibilities concerning cover of treatment costs.
- **If no coverage of your costs can be provided,**
 - You will pay all the costs of treatment (hospitalization costs and hemodialysis sessions) and the fixed daily charge as well as a deposit, calculated based on the duration of your stay.
- **Transport**
 - Your physician will prescribe the appropriate means of transport for your state of health (patient transport vehicle, ambulance, etc.).

You come for a consultation

- **If you do not have documents indicating full coverage of costs** by health insurance or medical assistance, you will need to pay :
 - either the entire cost of the consultation
 - or the third-party contribution of 30% of the social security fee schedule
- **If you benefit from 100% coverage of costs**
 - You have nothing to pay.
 - It should be noted that some offices do not accept third-party payment. In that case you will need to pay the consultation fee and will be reimbursed later.
